### OAKLAND UNIFIED SUMMER LEARNING PROGRAMS

OUSD seeks to provide students with summer learning opportunities to continue to build their skills through academic enrichment programs as well as provide extended learning opportunities to students below grade level. Contact your school for information on the opportunities below.

#### Bridge Programs

Bridge programs support rising 6th and 9th graders as they transition from elementary to middle school and middle school to high school. Students learn skills to help them transition successfully to the next grade and school. Contact your child's school for more information.

#### ELEV8 Transition Programs

Elev8 Summer Learning programs provide transition support to rising 6th and 9th graders at the Elev8 middle school sites. Contact the Elev8 Coordinator at 639-3336.

#### Early Childhood Education Centers

Provides programming for eligible children in grades K-3 during the summer. Contact the ECE Office at 639-3340.

#### High School Credit Recovery

Credit Recovery is offered to upper class students in need of academic credit recovery in order to graduate on time. Contact your child's high school counselor for more information.

#### Migrant/Refugee Education Program

The OUSD Migrant and Refugee Education Programs provide summer academic and enrichment opportunities for students K-12 and make referrals to community based-programs for additional support. For more information, please contact the OUSD Family & Community Office at 434-7752 extension 128.

#### Pre-Collegiate Academy

OUSD with the East Bay Consortium and Merritt College offer academies to Oakland youth to strengthen students' mathematical and literacy skills through summer enrichment courses and support services offered during the academic year to increase college eligibility. #### Programs for Exceptional Children

This program provides extended school year learning opportunities for severely handicapped students in accordance with their Individual Education Plans (IEPs). Contact the PEC Office at 879-8223.

#### SEEK (Summer Engineering Experience for Kids)

The summer Engineering Experience for Kids (SEEK) is the National Society of Black Engineers' (NSBE'S) free, three-week summer program that provides interactive, hands-on engineering activities for more than 650 students in grades three through eight.

#### Small Learning Communities Academy for Rising 9th graders (NEW)

Summer Intervention is offered at most school sites K-12 and provides students with intervention supports focused on Math and English Language Arts in elementary, middle and high schools, along with CAHSEE prep at the high schools. Contact your child's school for more information.

#### Summer Pre-K Camp

In partnership with First 5 California, OUSD offers a pre-K camp to entering kindergarteners with limited pre-school experience to build skills and access additional learning opportunities to ensure success in kindergarten. Contact the ECE Office at 639-3340

## 10 TIPS FOR SUMMER LEARNING

- **Get Active! Turn off the television and computer and play outside.**
- **Play with Puzzles.**
- **Visit Museums.**
- **Start a journal, diary, or scrapbook.**

- **Go grocery shopping and calculate the bill yourself.**
- **Plan dinner and learn about cooking and nutrition.**

- **Find a job or create your own by asking neighbors or relatives if they need help.**
- **Volunteer. Learn more about your community by volunteering in it.**

### Community Reading Buddies

Primary focus of the program is building language skills for children whose parents are not native English speakers: the volunteers lead trading activities, games and introduce academic topics such as science, music and art. The program has a far larger if less tangible impact, however the teenage volunteers act as mentors and “buddies” for their younger charges, providing them with role models. At the same time, the volunteers learn from the children they are teaching: it is an opportunity for the junior high and high school mentors to interact with neighbors who come from a very different background than their own. The mentors are provided with training in pedagogy and exposed to the challenges and rewards of teaching. Many students have participated in the program for multiple years. These veterans become part of the Leadership Team that helps structure the activities and guides the new mentors. Community Reading Buddies is about transferring knowledge in multiple directions. The “students” improve their language skills, while the “teachers” learn to teach: everyone learns more about the greater East Bay community. The success of this program can be seen in its longevity, the high return rate of former participants and the broad support it receives from parents and teachers.

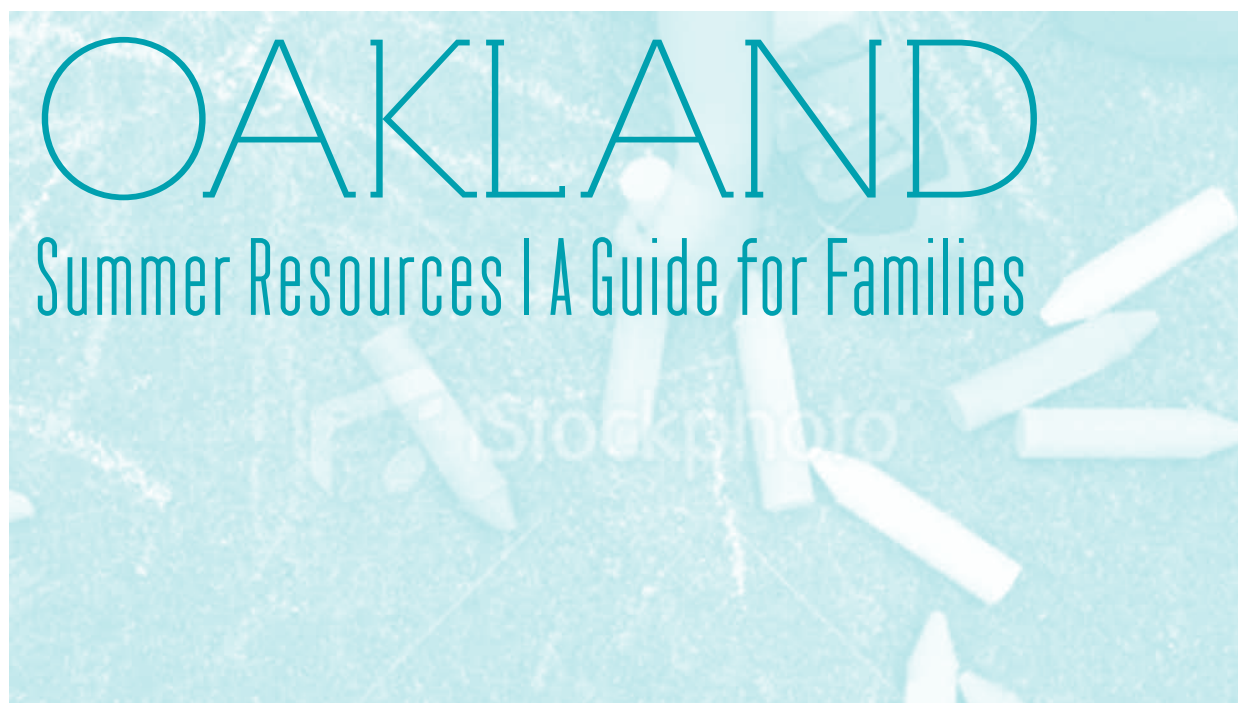
